SYNOPSIS

Requires certain health care facilities to offer, and employees to receive, annual influenza vaccination.

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

As reported by the Assembly Health and Senior Services Committee on May 13, 2019, with amendments.



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AN ACT concerning influenza vaccination of certain ¹[health care 1 workers] <u>employees</u>¹ and supplementing Title 26 of the Revised 2 3 Statutes. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. a. As used in this act: 9 "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Health. 10 "Health care facility" means a general or special hospital, nursing home, or home health care agency licensed pursuant to 11 12 P.L.1971, c.136 (C.26:2H-1 et seq.). ¹["Health care worker" means a person employed by a health 13 14 care facility who provides direct patient care or otherwise has contact with patients.]¹ 15 b. Commencing with the ¹[2013-2014] 2018-2019¹ influenza 16 season, each health care facility shall establish and implement an 17 18 annual influenza vaccination program in accordance with the 19 current recommendations of the Advisory Committee on 20 Immunization Practices of the federal Centers for Disease Control 21 and Prevention and any rules and regulations adopted by the 22 commissioner pursuant to this act. 23 c. For the purposes of its annual influenza vaccination 24 program, each health care facility shall: 25 (1) annually offer to provide an on-site or off-site influenza vaccination to each of its ¹ [health care workers] <u>employees</u>¹; 26 27 (2) require that each ¹[health care worker] <u>employee</u>¹ at the 28 facility receive an influenza vaccination ¹annually between October 1 and December 31 of the current influenza season,¹ provided by 29 the health care facility, except that ¹[a health care worker] an 30 employee¹ may, in lieu of receiving the influenza vaccination at the 31 32 facility, present acceptable proof, including an attestation from the ¹[health care worker] <u>employee</u>¹, of a current influenza vaccination 33 if the ¹[health care worker] <u>employee</u>¹ receives the vaccination 34 from another vaccination source, or sign a written declination 35 36 statement; (3) maintain a record or attestation, as applicable, of influenza 37 vaccinations for each ¹[health care worker] <u>employee</u>¹, retain each 38 signed declination statement from ¹[a health care worker] an 39 employee¹ who elects not to receive an influenza vaccination, and 40 report to the Department of Health, in a manner and according to a 41 42 schedule prescribed by the commissioner, the vaccination percentage rate of its ¹[health care]¹ workforce in receiving 43

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influenza vaccinations as part of the facility's annual vaccination program or by other means as attested to by the ¹[health care]¹ workforce, as applicable. The report may also include other information that the facility deems relevant to its vaccination percentage rate, including, but not limited to, the number of ¹[health care workers] <u>employees</u>¹ who signed declination statements that the facility has received;

8 (4) provide an educational component to its program that is 9 designed to inform ¹[health care workers] <u>employees</u>¹ about: 10 influenza vaccination; non-vaccine influenza control measures; and 11 the symptoms, transmission, and potential impact of influenza; and

(5) annually conduct an evaluation of the program with the goal
of improving the rate of vaccination among its ¹[health care
workers] employees¹.

d. A health care facility may suspend its annual offer of
influenza vaccination pursuant to this act in the event of a shortage
of influenza vaccine as determined by the commissioner.

18 e. (1) ¹[Any] <u>The commissioner may assess such penalties and</u> take other actions against a health care facility, as provided in 19 20 P.L.1971, c.136 (C.26:2H-1 et seq.), or any rules and regulations adopted pursuant thereto, for any¹ determination by the 21 commissioner of noncompliance by a health care facility or any of 22 its ¹[health care workers] <u>employees</u>¹ with the provisions of this 23 act¹[, based upon an inspection or survey conducted by the 24 Department of Health pursuant to section 5 of P.L.1971, c.136 25 26 (C.26:2H-5), or as otherwise determined by the commissioner, shall not constitute a licensure violation or deficiency with respect to that 27 28 facility for the purposes of P.L.1971, c.136 (C.26:2H-1 et seq.), or 29 any rules and regulations adopted pursuant thereto \mathbf{J}^1 .

30 (2) The commissioner shall seek to minimize any record-31 keeping burden imposed on a health care facility pursuant to this act 32 and shall take such actions as are necessary to ensure the 33 confidentiality of any data furnished to the department pursuant to 34 this act that may contain information identifying an individual 35 ¹[health care worker] employee¹.

36 (3) The commissioner shall make available to the public
37 aggregate data reported by a facility pursuant to paragraph (3) of
38 subsection c. of this section.

f. A health care facility shall not discharge or reduce the pay of
a health care worker who declines to receive an influenza
vaccination.

g. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit a health
care facility from taking measures to protect its patients in the event
that '[a health care workers] an employee¹ declines to receive an
influenza vaccination, which measures may include, but are not
limited to, relocation or change of assignment of '[a health care
workers] an employee¹.

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1 2. No later than August 1st of each year, the commissioner 2 shall report to the Governor, and to the Legislature pursuant to 3 section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), on the vaccination 4 percentage rates of health care workers for the prior influenza 5 season.

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7 3. The Commissioner of Health, pursuant to the
"Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et
9 seq.), shall adopt rules and regulations as necessary to implement
10 the provisions of this act.

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12 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
